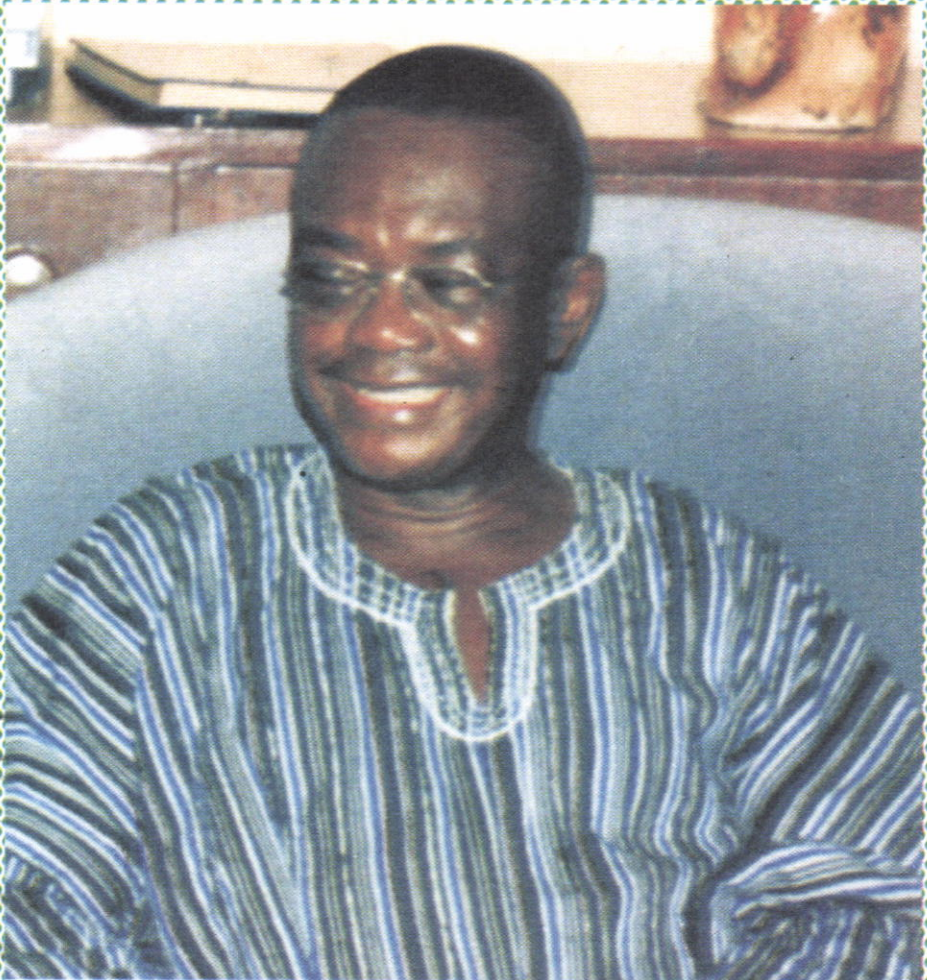

## **PERFORMANCE AUDIT REPORT OF THE AUDITOR-GENERAL INTO THE ADMINISTRATION OF GHANA GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS IN SECOND CYCLE INSTITUTIONS**

I have the honour to submit to you for presentation to Parliament my 12<sup>th</sup> performance audit report in pursuant to Article 187(5) of the 1992 Constitution and Section 13(e) of the Audit Service Act, Act 584. The Audit Service Act which came into force in November 2000, gives me authority to audit programmes and activities of public offices to ensure economy, efficiency and effectiveness in the use of resources.
