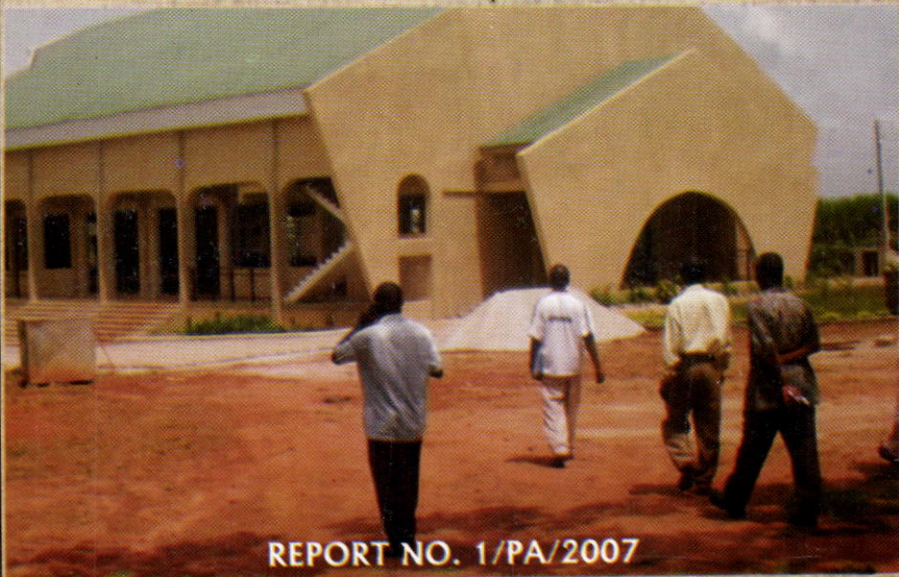

I have the honour to submit to you for presentation to Parliament my 16th Performance Audit Report in pursuant to Article 187(5) of the 1992 Constitution and Section 13(e) of the Audit Service Act, Act 584.
